As Covid-19 swept the world and our community, Circle of Friends quickly shifted operations, working tirelessly to move the "I CAN'T" mentality to "WE ARE"! Digging deeper into our mission, Circle of Friends reimagined the possibilities for building meaningful relationships to ensure our youth always had a Friend accessible and available.

Children First

Our Mentors showed up every week virtually, making contact through video conferencing, by phone, and even by mail when necessary. They helped with school work, making art or music, completing projects or simply being there to listen and remind our youth how resilient they are. Our Youth Program Director worked tirelessly to find unique and creative ways to create virtual programming and set up safe, outdoor spaces adhering to strict guidelines, for our youth's social interactions.

Building Relationships

With the shutdown of the nation and our state, school closures, and the rise of economic challenges, many of our families faced unexpected hardships. Circle of Friends worked closely with every family making sure essential needs were met; food, rent, childcare and resources for other necessities were found.



"This year seems to be very challenging for everyone, but so much so for my friend. Mostly I think I am a retreat from her everyday chaotic life. I just try to provide a safe place where she can talk/vent, provide her encouragement and stability, and a different perspective on how life can be lived. While she is still a teenager with teenage ideas, she has been through a lot and seen too much for someone her age. I think she is remarkable and I have high hopes that she will become a fantastic adult. We just take it one week at a time. Over time it has been encouraging to see the possible difference our friendship has made on both of us!"


Total Operating Revenue\$207,419
